We are blessed to have a pastor who seeks out these opportunities to learn and share with us.





Educational Opportunities



We have been blessed with not one but two grants to support our growing children's ministry! In August, we received a \$5,000 grant from Columbia Theological Seminary's Wonder of Worship Grants to support our children's ministry over the next two years. Then in September, we received the Circle of We grant from the Godly Play Foundation to receive all the story materials we need for our first year of Godly Play, worth hundreds of dollars. It is extremely exciting and humbling to receive such meaningful support from outside organizations who believe in what we are doing here at LPC.

Children ages 3 through 5th Grade and their parents are invited to our Godly Play Orientation on Saturday October 11th from 3:30-5:00pm at the church. The orientation is to teach both children and parents about what to expect in a Godly Play class. Everyone will have the opportunity to learn about what Godly Play is and then we will do an entire class together. If there are younger siblings, the nursery will be open (no childcare provided) for parents to be with them during the class session. This year, Godly Play will be once a month, before worship from 9:00-10:00am in the Fellowship Hall.

Sunday School note:

Elementary aged children will now stay in worship for the full worship service on the first Sunday of every month. Our hope is that this will give children more opportunities to get familiar with the language and rhythms of our worship service.

It also gives our Sunday school teachers a much needed break each month! We may make some small changes to our service on those Sundays to help our youngest worshippers feel that this service is for them, just as it is for the adult worshippers. What a gift it is to hear their small voices in our sanctuary each Sunday!

Treasurer's Update

At the end of last year, we predicted we would be about \$58,000 in debt at this point in the year (11/15/25). By the grace of God, many generous donors, and connections to good deals, we are lucky to not be at that number!

Currently we are in a surplus of about \$68,000 for the year so far. We have been able to stay ahead thanks to you all. We have used reserves to pay for our extra expenses this year, particularly the sewer fixes. We also got an amazing deal on three new furnaces this year and it truly saved our budget as well as reserves.

The expenses for Pastor Laura have gone down due to her being at $\frac{3}{4}$ time but that is about the only decrease in expenses for this last part of the year.

We received pledges for 2025 of \$88,000 for the whole year and have currently received \$114,000 from pledged households! It is great news for our church because we have so many ideas to continue to grow our church and fix up our building! We have already grown so much and look forward to all the possibilities ahead! Coming to LPC in 2026:

A return to our traditional committee structure

Over the past few years, Session has tried several different options for consolidating our standing Session-led committees and none of our creative solutions have been particularly successful. Session has decided to form the following committees for 2026:

Worship **Chair: TBD**

Responsible for: working with the Pastor to plan worship services, coordinating special music, and recruiting worship leaders & ushers

Buildings & Grounds **Chair: Jim Hall**

Responsible for: building maintenance, quarterly church clean-up, long-term maintenance, & managing church building use by outside groups

Christian Education **Chair: Jennifer Rogiers**

Responsible for: coordinating children's ministry (Sunday School, Godly Play etc.), planning Adult Education classes/ groups

Finance & Stewardship **Chair: Jamie Simons**

Responsible for: reviewing strategic financial decisions, budget planning, and coordinating Stewardship mailing

Social & Mission **Chair: Dauna Rittenhouse**

Responsible for: planning fellowship events for the congregation, mission projects, and community outreach.

Personnel **Chair: Becky Buescher**

Responsible for: supporting and overseeing church staff. Committee members are elected by the congregation.

Nominating **Chair: Jamie Simons**

Responsible for: nominating members to fill officer vacancies. Committee members are elected by the congregation.

If you are interested in serving on any of these committees next year, please talk to the chair. We're hoping for 3-4 members per team and teams are

planning to have quarterly meetings. More information will be coming in the new year.
