Letter from Pastor Laura



What is God up to? That's a question I've been asking myself for the past few months. When I arrived here two years ago as your new pastor, I knew that I was entering into the work that God was already doing in and through you. It wasn't the start of your ministry! So over the past two years, I've been slowly getting to know you as individual people and know this congregation as a community. I have loved that work. I love learning what gets you fired up and what makes your soul sing. I have loved learning the rhythms of our worshipping life together that makes this congregation unique. I learned that coffee hour is really the second half of the worship service. I learned that if there's a need, someone will find a way to fill it. I learned that loving each other like family means sticking it out through hard times and showing up in small ways, over and over again. I learned that I love being your pastor.

I've also been spending a lot of time listening for the voice of God, for it is Christ who is the head of this church, not me. Last year, the Session went through a year-long discernment process called the Feasibility Study, which ended with the congregational meeting in December. Session's motions passed by a slim margin at the meeting, which inspired a new round of discerning and dreaming,

this time with a new committee called the "LPC Action Plan Team." That team has been using Rooted Good's Good Futures Accelerator to dream about how God might be calling us to use our collective gifts and passions to serve the community of Lakewood in new and meaningful ways. We are still in the middle of that process, but I can already tell that **God is up to something exciting.** There are tiny whispers from the Holy Spirit everywhere I look— conversations with community members that unlock new ideas, new church members who are energized to serve, a gaggle of kids who bring so much joy to our worship together, and a love that propels me into action. Yes, I see that God is calling us into an exciting new chapter of our ministry together.

We'll be talking more about these nudges from the Holy Spirit in our Stewardship campaign called "Unfinished Business" and that will be October 12-26th, concluding with our annual Stewardship Potluck after worship on the 26th. There will be mailings going out early next month and I hope you'll join us in worship as we listen to God together about what it means for us to steward the gifts— the people, the land, and the resources— that we have been given to love and serve both God and neighbor.

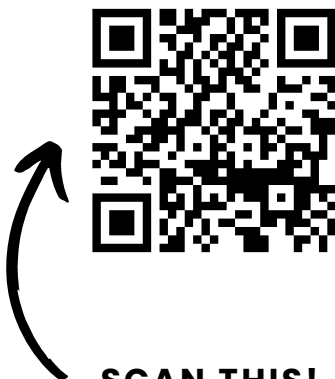

Educational Opportunities



We have been blessed with not one but two grants to support our growing children's ministry! In August, we received a \$5,000 grant from Columbia Theological Seminary's Wonder of Worship Grants to support our children's ministry over the next two years. Then in September, we received the Circle of We grant from the Godly Play Foundation to receive all the story materials we need for our first year of Godly Play, worth hundreds of dollars. It is extremely exciting and humbling to receive such meaningful support from outside organizations who believe in what we are doing here at LPC.

Children ages 3 through 5th Grade and their parents are invited to our Godly Play Orientation on Saturday October 11th from 3:30-5:00pm at the church. The orientation is to teach both children and parents about what to expect in a Godly Play class. Everyone will have the opportunity to learn about what Godly Play is and then we will do an entire class together. If there are younger siblings, the nursery will be open (no childcare provided) for parents to be with them during the class session. This year, Godly Play will be once a month, before worship from 9:00-10:00am in the Fellowship Hall.
